Established in 2006, this prestigious award scheme seeks to identify, celebrate and reward the very best examples of achievement by young people in Leicester and Leicestershire.

# Do you know someone tonominate?

The Award is open to young people aged 13-19 (as at Friday 17th February 2023) resident or attending full-time education in Leicester or Leicestershire.

The young person can be nominated by other young people, their school, parent/carer or any other agency.

The Award recognises the very best examples of achievement by young people in Leicester and Leicestershire.

There will be a separate award for each category. From the winners of these categories one person will be announced as Lord-Lieutenant's Young Person of the Year 2023.

Please note that this Award recognises individual achievement and joint or group nominations aren't accepted.

### £500 PRIZES TOBEWON

A panel of judges, which will include young people and chaired by the Lord-Lieutenant, will consider all nominations meeting the criteria for the award. The judges will shortlist four young finalists in each of the four categories.

The finalists and their guests will be invited to our special awards evening and dinner in the Spring to be hosted by the Lord-Lieutenant.

Category Winners will be announced at the Awards Ceremony, with each winner receiving a prize to the value of £500. Runners up will receive prizes to the value of £100.

The Category Winners will go forward to the culmination of the Awards Evening when the Lord-Lieutenant will announce who is the Lord-Lieutenant's Young Person of the Year 2023. This outstanding achievement will be marked by the presentation of a special trophy.

### History of the Office of Lord-Lieutenant

The Lord-Lieutenant is the official representative of His Majesty The King for the County and City of Leicester. The Office of Lord-Lieutenant is military in origin and can be said to date from the reign of Henry VIII. Until 1921 the Lord-Lieutenant still had the power to call on all able-bodied men of the County to fight in the case of need.

The traditional links with the military have been preserved in a modern form by the involvement of the Lord-Lieutenant with the Reserve Forces and Cadets Association, which embraces the Territorial Forces and the Cadet Corps. The Lord-Lieutenant also maintains connections with the uniformed civilian organisations, such as the Police, Fire and Ambulance services and many voluntary bodies, such as Red Cross, St. John and national and local youth organisations. Each year Mr Kapur appoints three young cadets to support him on ceremonial occasions.

Leicestershire's first Lord-Lieutenant, Henry Grey, 3rd Marquis of Dorset KG, was appointed in 1549. Upon the death of Edward VI he attempted to place his eldest daughter, Lady Jane Grey, upon the throne. This attempt failed and he was captured at Astley and was beheaded on Tower Hill on 23rd February 1554. The remains of the Grey's home can still be found in Bradgate Park.

## Nominate your Young Person of the Year 2023

The Lord-Lieutenant's Award for Young People focuses on four key themes and nominations will need to demonstrate that the young person has made a contribution to society which meets the criteria set out below.

### Young Person of **Courage of the Year**

Awarded to an individual who has:

- overcome personal barriers to achieve success
- made a stand against bullying, racism etc.
- demonstrated a life-saving act of bravery

### Young Volunteer 2 of the Year

Awarded to an individual who has:

- enhanced their local community or environment
- cared for a neighbour or relative in need
- helped run a community or sports based club or society

### YoungArtist of the Year

The Joe Humphries Memorial Award

Awarded to a young person who demonstrates real skill, innovation, and expression in:

- visual arts
- expressive arts
- literature, or
- music
